—应用简单的语句间的连接成分,使全文结构紧凑。

三档(适当):(11—15 分)

基本完成了试题规定的任务。

—虽漏掉一些内容,但覆盖所有主要内容。应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求。

—应用简单的语句间的连接成分,使全文内容连贯。

整体而言,基本达到了预期的写作目的。

二档(较差):(6—10 分)

未恰当完成试题规定的任务。

—漏掉或未描述清楚一些主要内容,写了一些无关内容。

—语法结构单调、词汇项目有限。

—有一些语法结构或词汇方面的错误,影响了对写作内容的理解。

—较少使用语句间的连接成分,内容缺少连贯性。

信息未能清楚地传达给读者。

一档(差):(1—5 分)

—明显遗漏主要内容,写了一些无关内容,原因可能使未理解试题要求。

—语法结构单调、词汇项目有限。

—较多语法结构或词汇方面地错误,影响了对写作内容的理解。

—缺乏语句间的连接成分,内容不连贯。

信息未能传达给读者。
