Some students have created a camera-operated weather balloon and sent it over 30 km into the Earth's atmosphere. ^㉓The readings they've got so far are incredibly detailed and could be helpful for weather forecasting and many other uses. The photographs taken by the balloon's camera are impressive too.

Something that's attracted media attention is another type of underwater vehicle, which can operate in the severest conditions. It can explore the ocean depths where there's absolutely no light, and it's being used to learn about the behavior of the most difficult to reach marine life. ^㉔There are hopes of taking it to the polar regions, where scientists hope to find out more about what might be living there.
