第一节（满分 15 分）

（一）内容要点

1. 发出合理的邀请，9 分；“合理”可包含的内容（非全选）：

（1）对活动内容概述。

（2）对活动意义概述。

（3）对外教 David 资质的认可。

2. 询问时间，3 分；注意措辞的得体性。

3. 合乎文体和交际功能的开头和结尾，3 分；

（二）评分原则

1. 本题总分为 15 分，按 5 个档次给分。

2. 评分时，先根据文章的内容和语言初步确定其所属档次，然后以该档次的要求来衡量，确定或调整档次，最后给分。

3. 词数少于 80 和多于 130 的，从总分中减去 2 分。

4. 评分时应注意的主要内容为：内容要点、应用词汇和语法结构的丰富性和准确性及上

下文的连贯性。

5. 拼写与标点符号是语言准确性的一个方面。评分时应视其对交际的影响程度予以考虑。英、美拼写及词汇用法均可接受。

（三）评分标准

第五档(13-15分)：完全完成了试题规定的任务，完全达到了预期的写作目的
覆盖所有内容要点。

应用了较多的语法结构和词汇。

语法结构或词汇方面有些许错误，但为尽力使用较复杂结构或较高级词汇所致；具备较强的语言运用能力。

有效地使用了语句间的连接成分，使全文结构紧凑。

第四档(10-12分)：完全完成了试题规定的任务，达到了预期的写作目的
虽漏掉次重点，但覆盖所有主要内容。

应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求。

语法结构或词汇方面应用基本准确，些许错误主要是因尝试较复杂语法结构或词汇所致。

应用简单的语句间的连接成分，使全文结构紧凑。

第三档(7-9分)：基本完成了试题规定的任务，整体而言，基本达到了预期的写作目的
虽漏掉一些内容，但覆盖所有主要内容。

应用的语法结构和词汇能满足任务的要求。

有一些语法结构或词汇方面的错误，但不影响理解。

应用简单的语句间的连接成分，使全文内容连贯。

第二档(4-6分)：未恰当完成试题规定的任务，信息未能清楚地传达给读者
漏掉或未描述清楚一些主要内容，写了一些无关内容。

语法结构单调、词汇知识有限。

有一些语法结构或词汇方面的错误，影响了对写作内容的理解。

较少使用语句间的连接成分，内容缺少连贯性。

第一档(1-3分)：未完成试题规定的任务，信息未能传达给读者
明显遗漏主要内容，写了一些无关内容，原因可能是未理解试题要求。

语法结构单调、词汇知识有限。

较多语法结构或词汇方面的错误，影响对写作内容的理解。

缺乏语句间的连接成分，内容不连贯。

不得分(0分)：未能传达给读者任何信息；内容太少，无法评判；所写内容均与所要求内容无关或所写内容无法看清。

(二) 评分标准

1. 本题总分为 25 分, 按七个档次进行评分。
2. 评分时, 主要从内容、语言表达和篇章结构三个方面考查, 具体为: 续写内容质量、续写的完整性以及与原文情境的融洽度。
3. 评分时, 应先根据作答的整体情况确定其所属的档次, 然后以该档次的要求来综合衡量, 确定或调整档次, 最后给分。
4. 评分时还应注意:

(1) 词数少于 120 的，酌情扣分：

(2) 单词拼写和标点符号是写作规范的重要方面。评分时应视其对交际的影响程度予以考虑。英美拼写及词汇用法均可接受。

(3) 书写较差以致影响交际的，酌情扣分。

档次	给分要求
第七档 (22-25 分)	创造了丰富、合理的内容，富有逻辑性，续写完整，与原文情景融洽度高；使用了多样且恰当的词汇和语法结构、表达流畅，语言错误很少，且完全不影响理解；自然有效地使用了段落间、句间衔接手段，全文结构清晰，前后呼应，意义连贯。
第六档 (18-21 分)	创造了比较丰富、合理的内容，比较有逻辑性，续写比较完整，与原文情景融洽度较高；使用了比较多样且恰当的词汇和语法结构，表达比较流畅，有个别错误，但不影响理解；比较有效地使用了语句间衔接手段，全文结构比较清晰，意义比较连贯。
第五档 (15-17 分)	创造了基本合理的内容，有一定的逻辑性，续写基本完整，与原文情境相关；使用了比较恰当的词汇和语法结构，表达方式不够多样性，表达有些许错误，但基本不影响理解；使用了语句衔接手段，全文结构比较清晰，意义比较连贯。
第四档 (11-14 分)	创造了基本完整的故事内容，但有的情节不够合理或逻辑不强，与原文情景基本相关；使用了简单的词汇和语法结构，有部分语言错误和不恰当之处，个别部分影响理解；尚有语句衔接的意识，全文结构基本清晰，意义基本连贯。
第三档 (6-10 分)	内容和逻辑上有一些重大问题，续写不够完整，与原文有一定程度脱节；所用的词汇有限，语法结构单调，错误较多且比较低级，影响理解；未能有效地使用语句衔接手段，全文结构不够清晰，意义欠连贯。
第二档 (1-5 分)	内容和逻辑上有较多重大问题，或有部分内容抄自原文，续写不完整，与原文情景基本脱节；所使用的词汇非常有限，语法结构单调，错误极多，严重影响理解；几乎没有使用语句衔接手段，全文结构不清晰，意义不连贯。
第一档 (0 分)	未作答，所写内容太少或无法看清以致无法判断，缩写内容全部抄自原文或与题目要求完全不相关。

At university, I tried to discover what made people happy. I started by studying creative people like artists because they devoted their lives to doing what they wanted to, rather than things that brought them money. Later I invented a study method. Ordinary people were asked to keep an electronic machine for a week, which gave out a sound eight times a day. Every time it did so, they wrote down where they were, what they were doing, how they felt and how much they were concentrating. I found that as with creative people, ordinary people are happiest when concentrating hard. So the most obvious cause of happiness is concentration.

I have spent my life in studying happiness, and my belief that I have found the key to its secret has increased my happiness greatly.
